Curriculum

The school offers an American curriculum based on the AERO (*American Education Reaches Out*) Standards to both Moroccan and international students, from pre-kindergarten to Grade 12. The academic program includes six core courses (English, math, science, history, Arabic and French) and a selection of electives. The school currently operates on a semester system. Students are involved in a wide array of co-curricular and service learning activities.

GPA

Beginning in Grade 9, grades in all subjects are included in the GPA computation. A minimum of 28 credits is required for graduation. Certain electives are offered on a pass/fail basis. Additionally, all students are required to complete a 40-hour service learning requirement to graduate. AP and Seminar classes are weighted by one point. Honors classes are weighted by 0.3 points.

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
